



Drops First Single from Newly-released Album: “FOR SUCH A TIME AS THIS”

**Dynamic testimony to modern events,
“Where Is My Eden”
to hit streaming platforms
February 19, 2026**

After nearly a lifetime, the long-awaited album release by renown rock band, Adonis, is here. “For Such a Time As This” chronicles the musical song-writing and dynamic performances of Adonis and its members, fifty years in the making.

With songs from the late 70s, 90s, 2000s and 2020s, The origins of the band’s signature sound can be followed and discovered. A hard-rocking, heart-beating symmetry of classical rock anthems, choir-like harmonies and live performance acumen, tens of thousands in the northeast US remember Adonis.

Adonis' debut single, “Where Is My Eden”, drops to streaming platforms worldwide this February 19, 2026. The first song written by Adonis collaborators Michael Macari, Steve Matsis and Peter Klein, “Where is My Eden” is a foreboding testimony on world events. The song begins with the sound of a haunting, contemporary mock newscast, foreshadowing a reflection on the world events of today.

Not simply a reflection, but a torturous plea for clarity, “Where Is My Eden” begins with the question poised posed by the vocalist on “How did we get here? What’s going on?”

“For Such a Time as This”, and “Where Is My Eden” are being released to streaming platforms worldwide, distributed by Symphonic distributors this February '26.

The Adonis “sound” has been compared to Genesis, Kansas, Styx, even Pink Floyd with a choir of vocals and orchestration. Some say it is Mannheim Steamroller outside of Christmas, an original sound.

The band will release its second single, “Room Full of Blues” in April 2026. A lament on hero worship and the loneliness that accompany musicians and songwriters, Room Full of Blues is a four-part anthem that climaxes in profound hope.
